

Lesson Plans Reception/KS1

Our Nursery classes are roughly equivalent to Nursery, Reception and Year 1 in the UK

- 1. Comparing your children's lives with our children's lives (Our lives videos) Watch the KS1 video. What are the similarities/differences between their lives and the children of COH? How would their lives be different if they lived in Namatala?
- 2. Craft Activity- in this activity they use glue made out of flour and water to carry out two activities:

A butterfly made using bottle tops:





Flowers, fish, chains and fans made out of strips of paper:

3. Song (Nursery song video): Teacher Stella demonstrates singing a song about the lack of rain for animals. You could split your class into four groups and they could be the four animals: tortoise, cow, goat and bird.

Okolodong imonyiyo? Imonyisio akiru, akiru, akiru
Tortoise why are you crying? We are crying for rain, rain, rain
Emonyete akutuc da- mo, mo, mo, mo imonyisio akiru
Even the cows are crying- moo, moo, moo, we are crying for rain
Emonyete akinei da- me, me, me imonyisio akiru
Even the goats are crying- mee, mee, mee, we are crying for rain
Emonyete akwany da- chii-chii-chii, chii imonyisio akiru
Even the birds are crying- cheep, cheep, cheep, cheep we are crying for rain.

4. PE Lesson: Have fun joining in this PE lesson involving a lot of jumping!! (Nursery PE lesson)

Game 1:

Letta letta- Bambala; Letta letta- bambala (x4)

Bring bring a fish; bring, bring a fish!

Game 2: This is a call and response game. The teacher sings/says the first part of each line and the children respond with kiri-munyumba (in the house)

Ekibobo- kiri-munyumba

A basket- in the house

Jangu O'kilabye- kiri-munyumba

Come and see- in the house

Jangu jangu- kiri-munyumba

Come come- in the house

Dayoo dayoo- kiri-munyumba

Go go- in the house

- 5. Story (traditional story video) Watch the story- can your children act out an African story eg Handa's Surprise or We're going on a Lion Hunt
- 6. Dance (traditional dance video) The children demonstrate a traditional dance from the Bugishu tribe. Watch the video and see if you can learn some of the moves!
